



What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will be improving 28 miles of I-696 (Reuther Freeway) in Oakland and Macomb counties. Work begins in April and is expected to be finished in November 2018, except noted otherwise.

Oakland County:

I-275/M-5 interchange to Dequindre Road Work includes concrete pavement and joint repairs, drainage system repairs and minor structure repairs.

Macomb County: Deguindre Road to Nieman Street

Work includes pavement replacement (roadway, ramps and shoulders), drainage system repairs, and service drive repairs (scheduled for 2019).

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

Oakland

Oakland County:

All lanes will be open weekdays during daytime hours. Multiple lanes will be closed nights and weekends, with a minimum of one lane open in each direction at all times. The freeway will be closed for a maximum of 10 weekends (split into four segments).

Macomb County:

Stage 1: Westbound I-696 will be closed and detoured from I-94 to I-75. Eastbound I-696 will remain open.

Stage 2: Westbound I-696 traffic remains detoured. Eastbound I-696 will be reduced to three lanes and shifted onto the westbound side of the freeway with limited exit ramps (Dequindre Road, Mound Road, Groesbeck Highway). All entrance ramps to eastbound I-696 will be closed.

Long-term Benefits

This project will extend the life of the roadway and allow for better traffic flow along the Reuther Freeway in Oakland and Macomb counties.
